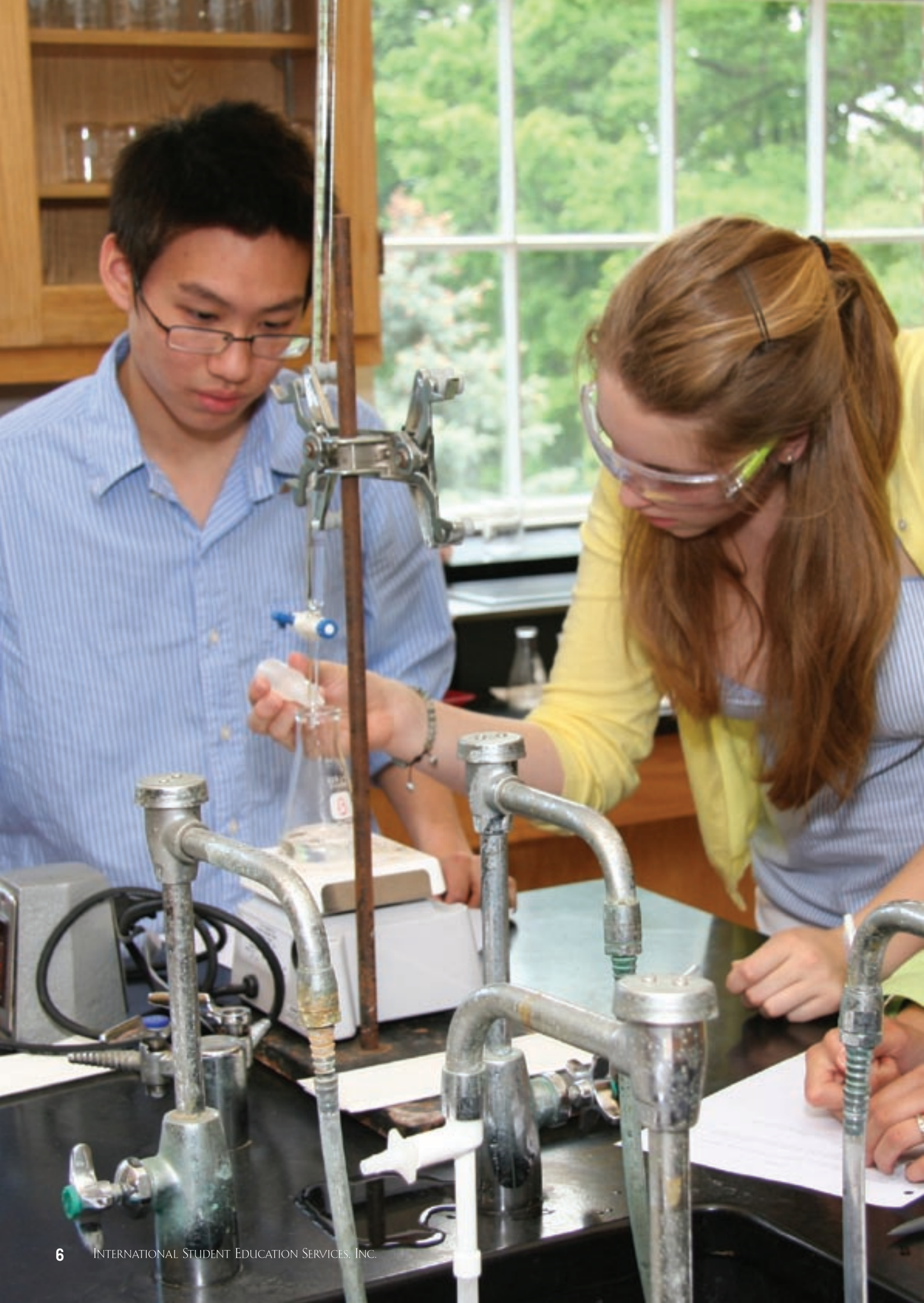

Graduate Programs

Available to students who have earned an undergraduate (bachelor's) degree in their own country or in North America and plan to continue their education.

Undergraduate Programs

These bachelor-degree programs offered at universities and four-year colleges are for students who have obtained a secondary school diploma.

Two-Year Programs of Study

Created for students with a secondary school diploma who plan to earn an associate degree, begin their studies at an institution with ESL support or improve their academic record for transfer to a more selective four-year university.

Preparatory (Boarding) Schools

Recommended for motivated students who seek a challenging college preparatory program that will improve their potential for admission into the university of their choice.

ESL Programs

Available to those students who need to strengthen their English proficiency prior to enrolling in one of ISES's partner universities.

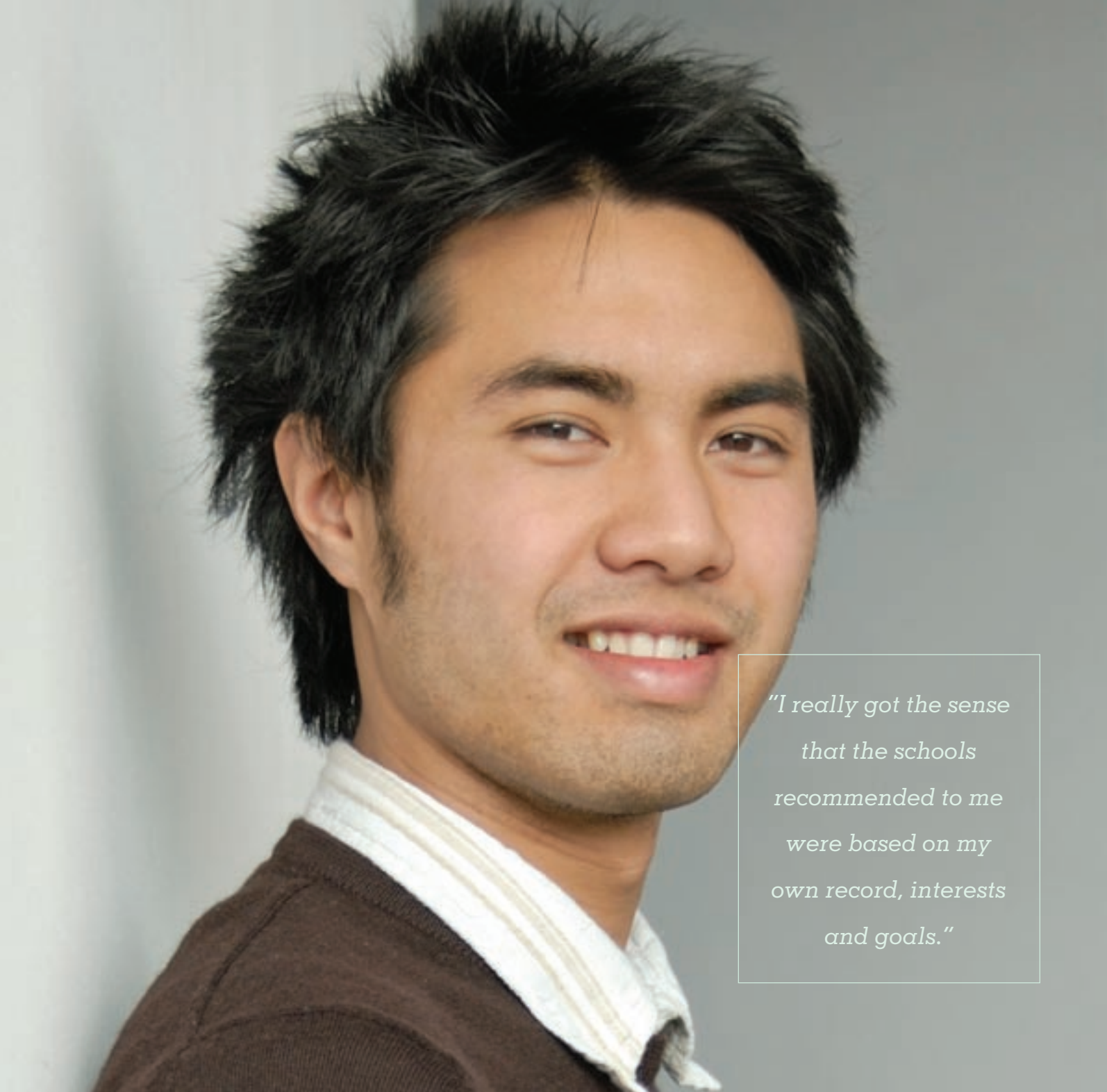

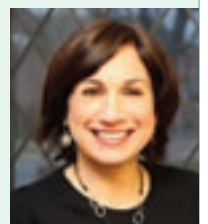
All ISES partner universities and schools have received full accreditation by their appropriate regional accreditation agencies. These are the two types of accreditations that are awarded:

Regional: Universities and schools periodically undergo evaluation by a team of educators. They use accepted standards recognized by their peers for assessing curriculum, qualifications of faculty, adequacy of facilities, etc.

Professional: Certain academic disciplines—engineering and architecture, for example—require evaluation and approval by a team of professional educators and practitioners for assessing curriculum, qualifications of faculty, adequacy of facilities, etc., in order for their students to sit for national licensure examinations.

Preparatory School Programs

Start early to prepare for university studies.

Private preparatory schools with their challenging curricula are recommended for younger students preparing for admission into a top-rated university.

Here students receive excellent guidance in strengthening their English language, writing and critical thinking skills. These academic achievements will also help them to fulfill university entrance requirements when they are ready to apply. *Normally, 98% of students in preparatory schools successfully advance into university.*

ISES partner preparatory schools are found primarily in the Philadelphia/New York/Boston area of the United States. These schools feature beautiful residential campuses, modern dormitories and dining halls, small classrooms and university-level facilities.

Entry into private preparatory schools, sometimes referred to as “boarding schools,” is typically for young people ages 14-18 and admission is competitive.



An average day at a preparatory school.

Classroom sizes are small, usually about 5 to 15 students which allows for a great deal of personal attention and interaction with the teachers. After class, students can participate in afternoon activities including athletics, music and art. Evening hours are usually devoted to study hall and of course there is free time to socialize with other students.

ESL University Programs

Increase your English language skills at the university level.

Many international students begin their university studies in an ESL (English as a Second Language) Transition Program for at least one semester. This program is designed for those students who do not have the required English language proficiency or TOEFL/IELTS scores required for acceptance into an undergraduate program. It will help you to master reading, writing, speaking, time management and basic study skills required for university success.

Your current degree of English proficiency will determine if:

- 1.) you must first complete an ESL Transition Program before starting your undergraduate studies, or
- 2.) you can participate in the ESL program and your undergraduate studies at the same time.

Besides language training, the ESL program provides the opportunity to earn credits towards your degree. You can gradually take more basic university courses as your language skills improve.

ESL Transition Programs are typically divided into two levels.

Level One: Focuses on improving basic language and academic abilities by attending speaking, reading, grammar and writing classes. When you successfully complete these classes and demonstrate an improvement in fluency, you then progress into more advanced English.

Level Two: More challenging English language classes are integrated with academic courses.

As more universities are raising their TOEFL/IELTS requirements, it is increasingly important to sharpen your English language skills through an ESL Transition Program. You'll gain the confidence and ability to communicate effectively in English as you progress further into your academic studies.

Course choices during Transition normally include mathematics, computers and fine arts. ESL students must meet academic requirements in order to be offered conditional admission to the university. Once the TOEFL/IELTS requirements have been achieved, students matriculate into the degree program of choice.

Enjoy participating in a small classroom setting!

One of the first things you will notice at an ISES partner private university is how few students there are in your classes. Classroom sizes are purposely kept small so you receive the highest level of individual instruction and guidance from your professors. The average ratio between students and professors is 15:1.

Take advantage of this relaxed, informal learning environment to interact freely with your professors and share your opinions. Students often develop friendly relationships with their professors that continue long after graduation.

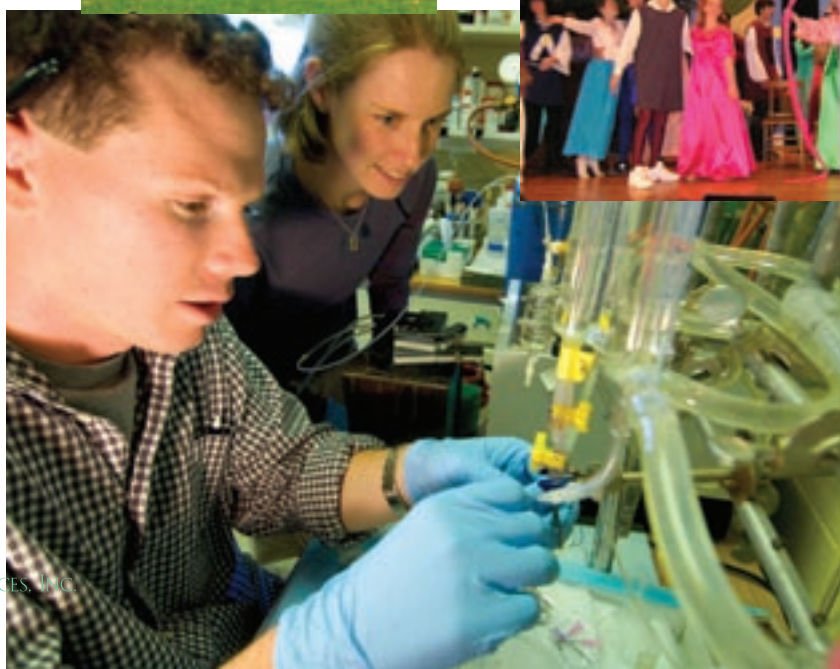
One of the other distinct advantages of a private university is that all of your courses are taught by qualified professors. Graduate students normally teach introductory and lower-level classes in public universities.



Why are elective courses so important to your education?

During your undergraduate program, there are a number of courses you'll study that complement your major field of interest but may not relate directly to it. These are referred to as "elective" courses and you may select which ones you wish to take from a broad variety of possibilities.

Elective courses broaden your overall education and improve your critical thinking. You'll learn how to analyze and integrate information and express yourself on a wide range of subjects. These are all valuable assets you will use throughout your life.



A typical campus in the United States

is filled with activity inside *and* outside class.

The campus is at the heart of every private university and preparatory school. This is where students learn, live, interact, play, socialize and mature into successful young adults ready to enter the next chapter in their lives.



Here are some facilities you can expect to find on a typical campus:

Small **lecture hall classrooms** give you a close and rewarding connection with your professors.

Use the **library** as a valuable resource for research or as a place to study.

Live in a safe, modern **residence hall** and forge a friendship with an English-speaking roommate.

The **dining hall** offers different nutritious meals to satisfy every appetite.

Attend music, plays and other cultural events at the **theater**.

Participate in class projects or independent studies in state-of-the-art science **laboratories**.

Socialize with other students and enjoy recreational activities in the **communal meeting center**.

Keep in shape in a **fitness center** featuring a pool, weights, treadmill, and other equipment.

Athletic fields provide numerous sports activities for you to participate in, including basketball, soccer, tennis, and baseball.

Understanding the difference between associate and bachelor degree programs.

Two-Year Colleges

There are many two-year institutions that offer **associate degree programs** in diverse fields such as the liberal arts and sciences, business, engineering technology, and the visual and performing arts. These are often referred to as community or junior colleges. After graduating, you can then transfer at the third-year level into a university offering a four-year bachelor's degree.

A diploma from a secondary school and supporting materials including transcripts, test scores, recommendations and writing samples are required for entry into two-year colleges. Admission is usually less competitive than at the four-year university level.

Universities/Four-Year Colleges

Thousands of universities are located throughout the United States offering **undergraduate (bachelor's) degrees** in a wide range of subjects. A partial list of these subjects include sciences; visual and performing arts; liberal arts (history, philosophy, literature, journalism, etc.); social sciences (psychology, sociology, etc.); education; business; architecture and design; and engineering. You are normally required to complete a core curriculum prior to pursuing your chosen academic discipline.

A diploma from a secondary school and supporting materials including transcripts, test scores, recommendations and writing samples are required for entry into a bachelor's degree program.

After completing your bachelor's degree, you may choose to advance your studies on the graduate level. Master, doctoral and professional degrees are offered in a similarly wide range of subject areas at many universities and some colleges.

Entry to advanced degree programs require that you have a four-year bachelor's degree from an accredited university in North America or elsewhere in the world. You must also provide supporting materials including transcripts indicating an appropriate level of academic achievement, test scores, recommendations and writing samples.

Your journey

Arranging Your Stay in the United States

ISES will assist you every step to becoming an international student.

Traveling to the United States to study is a major step in your education and filled with details. Both you and your family can depend on ISES to assist you with all the necessary arrangements and paperwork. From your first interview to helping you settle into your first day as a student—and through graduation—we will be there to assist you.

Here is a brief summary of services to help make your planning easy and reduce any stress:

Initial Interview

Your ISES representative will be your first contact with ISES in your home country. He or she will interview you and begin the process in helping you to choose the right preparatory school or university based on your academic background and career plans. This representative will also assist you to prepare and submit your application.

Pre-Departure Assistance

After you have applied and been accepted, you will receive from ISES a comprehensive guide detailing all the information you need to know to prepare for your education in the United States. We'll also help you gather the necessary travel documents and visa.

Arrival

In making your travel arrangements, you should plan to arrive on the weekend before your courses begin. This will provide you with

plenty of time to get settled in and familiarize yourself with your new surroundings.

Please keep your ISES representative informed of your travel plans. This allows us to arrange your transportation to your university or school once you arrive in the United States.

Orientation Welcome

You will receive a complete orientation upon your arrival to welcome you to your school or university and also to help you become acquainted with the campus. Besides learning about the different academic, residential, cultural and sports facilities, you'll also become familiar with the local surrounding area and available transportation.

Student Services

Where should I go if I need medical treatment? How do I set up a bank account? What kinds of student activities can I join? No doubt you'll have many questions as a new student. Your international student advisor will inform you of the different student services available to assist you on a wide range of non-academic issues.

Qualification Requirements

Here's how to determine if you qualify.

Find out if you may apply to an ISES partner university or preparatory school by reviewing these five qualifications:

As an applicant, YOU MUST:

1. Be at least 17 years of age or older for the university programs and at least 14 years of age for the preparatory school program.
2. Provide the required academic record and test scores for each program of study.
3. Have an appropriate level of English proficiency unless applying to a school or university that has an ESL or transition program.
4. Be able to provide certifiable evidence—for visa purposes—that your family has sufficient funds to support a United States university or preparatory school education.
5. Be a non-US citizen with your primary residence outside the United States.

Application Procedure

We've made the process easy for you!

Applying to study in the United States can involve many hours of your time. ISES guarantees to make the process simpler, easier and faster. We'll also check your finished application very carefully so you never need to worry about submitting incorrect or incomplete information.

How much faster can ISES help you in the application process? You will receive acknowledgement of your inquiry or application within 48 hours. After that, information on your admission status will be sent to you within two to three weeks.

Here is how simple it is to complete your ISES Application for Admission:

1. Submit the application, indicating your three choices in order of preference—only one application is required.
2. Include appropriate original transcripts (with translated and certified copies if originals are not in English)

3. Include certified financial documents
4. Include recommendations
5. Include test score as required
6. Include application deposit

Application Deadlines

ISES partner schools and universities have extended deadlines for our applicants. Spaces for students do fill quickly so it is highly recommended that you submit your application early. This will greatly improve the possibility of being accepted at the educational institution of your choice.

Payment Schedule

Payment for most ISES programs is expected by **1 June** for fall semester admissions, and by **1 November** for spring semester admissions.



Education Definitions

Basic vocabulary terms you'll find useful.

There are many terms frequently associated with education in the United States that may be unfamiliar to you. ISES hopes that the following definitions may be helpful to you. Your local representative will be happy to review them with you.



DEGREES – LEVELS OF STUDY

Associate of Arts – A.A.

A two-year degree in the liberal arts

Associate of Sciences – A.S.

A two-year degree in the sciences, engineering technology, or business

Bachelor of Arts – B.A.

A four-year degree from a university (or college) in the liberal arts

Bachelor of Science – B.S.

A four-year degree from a university (or college) in the sciences, business, or engineering

Bachelor of Architecture – B.Arch

a professional degree from a university in architecture

Bachelor of Fine Arts – B.F.A.

a four-year degree in the visual arts (drawing, painting, sculpture, etc.)

Master of Business

Administration – M.B.A.

an advanced degree in business

Master of Arts – M.A.

an advanced degree in the liberal arts

Master of Science – M.S.

an advanced degree in the sciences or engineering

Master of Education – M.Ed

an advanced degree in education

Master of Fine Arts – M.F.A.

an advanced degree in the visual arts

Doctor of Philosophy – Ph.D

the most advanced degree available in the liberal arts, sciences, and engineering

Doctor of Education – Ed.D

the most advanced degree available in education

Doctor of Medicine- M.D.

the necessary degree to practice medicine

Doctor of Law – LL.D.

the necessary degree to practice law



CURRICULUM

Major: the chief area of study for students to select—generally a minimum of ten to twelve courses in the student's chosen discipline

Minor: a secondary area of study for students to select—a "minor" is not required at all United States universities—generally a minimum of six to eight courses in the student's discipline

General Education: courses in the liberal arts and sciences, sometimes called "the core," that form the base of foundation of a university education

Electives: course that students freely may choose over their four-year degree program to complement their major, minor and general education courses.

AREAS OF STUDY

Liberal Arts: literature, history, philosophy; Social Sciences: psychology, sociology, political science; Sciences: biology, chemistry, physics, geology, astronomy; Visual Arts: drawing, painting, sculpture, and graphic design

Performing Arts: theater, music, and dance

Business: management, marketing, accounting, finance, and international business

Engineering: electrical, computer, mechanical, civil, environmental, and electronic

Design: architecture, interior design, landscape architecture, and fashion design

Computer Science and Technology

Pre-Professional Programs: preparation for advanced study in law, medicine, pharmacy, physical therapy, veterinary studies



LENGTH OF STUDY

Universities in the United States typically sponsor two sessions, called semesters, in each academic year. Semesters are fifteen weeks long. Students earn undergraduate (bachelor's) degrees in four years. Please see page 20 for an example.

HOURS/CREDITS/GRADES

Each university course typically meets for three or four hours per week. On the average, students enroll in four or five courses in each fifteen-week semester. Each course usually carries three or four credits towards an undergraduate degree requirement of 120 credits. Evaluation of a student's performance is reflected in grades provided at the end of each semester. Grades are given on the following scale: Excellent (4.0), Good (3.0), Poor (2.0), and Failing (0.0).



ESL PROGRAMS

Many universities offer ESL instruction to help develop a student's speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills prior to beginning a degree program. For more information on ESL Transition Programs on the university level, please read page 15.



PRIVATE UNIVERSITIES

Most universities in the United States are considered "private" because they rely on income from students and their families, and gifts from donors. A few well-known examples include Harvard, Yale and Brown.

PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES

These universities receive a large share of their income from state governments. Ohio State and the University of California at Berkeley are two examples of public universities.
